

Keeping Our Community Clean, Green, and Thriving

CSCC Student-Athletes Help Clean Up Downtown

118 student athletes and coaches from Cleveland State Community College volunteered their time to clean up downtown Cleveland on Friday, September 28, 2018.

This cleanup was in partnership with Cleveland/Bradley Keep America Beautiful, the Cleveland Public Works Department and Cleveland Pickers, a local group dedicated to keeping the city clean.

Students and community partners met at First Street Square and spread out to cover five heavily traveled downtown blocks. These were areas surrounding landmarks such as Johnston Park, the Old Woolen Mill and the Museum Center at Five Points.

As they combed their way through the city blocks, students picked up 4,840 lbs. of litter and debris, and pulled weeds along the way.

This event was sponsored by the following local businesses; Home Depot of Cleveland, Static Salon, Ever After Bridal, The Catch, Mash and Hops, Stack Southern Bistro, Trail Heads, The Press, and Cleveland-Bradley Keep America Beautiful.

On October 6, 2018, 399 residents participated in the Bradley County annual fall Household Hazardous Waste Collection event.

Upon entering the Bradley County Justice Center, a survey was conducted. 217 Bradley County residents participated, along with 146 City of Cleveland residents 5 other surrounding county residents. 164 residents participated in the event for the first time.

A total of 31,854 lbs. of waste was collected at the event. The top three waste materials disposed of were paint at 16,999lbs., electronics at 7,945lbs., and paper at 3,900lbs. Other items accepted was automotive & marine products, home improvement & maintenance, lawn & garden, and miscellaneous items such as pool chemicals and fluorescent light bulbs.

The Better Business Bureau partnered in the event for a second time, and is now a permanent participating sponsor for document shredding.

Other sponsors for the event was Santek Waste Services, Bradley County Government, Cleveland Utilities, Bradley County Sheriff's Department, and Cleveland-Bradley Keep America Beautiful.


