The City of Cleveland Stormwater program is co-sponsoring this year's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day.

Acceptable items include: paint, thinners, strippers, cleaners, stains, varnishes, motor oil, fuel additives, batteries, rust solvents, starter fluid, roofing tar, adhesives, pesticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals, medicines, aerosols, fluorescent bulbs, CPU's, TV's, monitors, keyboards, printers, just to name a few. Improper disposal can



pollute the environment and pose a health hazard. Please dispose of these items properly.

## Yard Waste/Debris Removal - Reminder

The Public Works Department would like to remind residents to place yard waste in a separate pile from other bulk/debris items. Leaves and grass clippings must be bagged for removal (except during the months of October thru February, "leaf season".) Bagged debris should be placed in clear plastic bags. Items in dark bags are often mistaken for household garbage (to be picked up by Waste Connections.) Public Works does not accept demolition materials, debris from a cleared lot or hazardous waste such as paint, motor oil, tires, or any of the items listed above. Hazardous waste items will not be picked up.

Debris must be placed curbside, the evening before your scheduled pick up day, or no later than 7 a.m. the day of collection. It must be easily accessible and must not pose a threat of potential property damage by our equipment. ## Help Keep Storm Drains Clean

Here are a few steps you can take to help keep storm drains clean and lessen and/or prevent street flooding.

1. Keep inlets and storm drains clean and free of debris in front of your property.
2. Bag leaves in clear bags. Do not rake leaves, grass clippings or any material in ditches, culverts or drains. Leaves and debris can cause a clog in the drainage system.
3. Never block any part of the city's drainage system. Set a positive example by being an active steward of your neighborhood.
4. Maintain the drainage system on your property. It is the owners responsibility to maintain private property.
5. Make sure your drainage system directs water away from your foundation and your neighbors foundation.
6. Remember to clean gutters and downspouts.
