**\$114 MILLION AUTOMOTIVE COMPONENT PLANT  
COMING TO SPRING BRANCH INDUSTRIAL PARK**

The City of Cleveland is excited about Cannon Automotive Solutions, a maker of metal automotive components, coming to Cleveland. Cannon Automotive Solutions will be the first tenant for Spring Branch Industrial Park. The company is under construction and plans to start production in 2022. In a four year period, the company will invest \$114 million and will have created 197 jobs.

Mayor Kevin Brooks said the Industrial Park is a premiere site location for the next generation of manufacturing. He added "Cleveland, Tennessee is the best place to be if you are looking for quality people, a low-cost business environment, and a region with an outstanding quality of life and a bright future."



The 331.6 acre industrial park is expected to attract additional companies that will provide thousands of jobs and generate millions of payroll dollars. We would like to thank the Chamber of Commerce, Cleveland/Bradley Industrial Development Board, Cleveland Utilities, TVA, TN Dept of Economic & Community Development and numerous others for their committment in working behind the scenes to make this a reality.

## Christmas Tree Safety Tips

### Stay Safe As You Deck The Halls This Holiday Season

- Choose a tree with fresh green needles that do not fall off when touched. Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights. Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect. Use indoor approved lights for indoor trees. Always turn off lights to tree when leaving your home or going to bed.
- Replenish water daily to the tree stand of fresh trees.
- Remove the tree when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home. Bring in outdoor lights after the holidays to prevent hazards and will make them last longer.
